In Memoriam

The Department of Anthropology was saddened to hear of the deaths of four past members of our community - **Dr. Art Gallaher**, and alumni **Dr. Ahmed Herzenni**, **Dr. Olaf Jaime Riverón**, and alum **Chi Woodrich**.

Dr. Art Gallaher was a cultural and applied anthropology faculty member who chaired the department from 1970-1972 and later served as the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences (1972-1980) and Chancellor (1982-1989).

Dr. Ahmed Herzenni was a Moroccan intellectual and human rights activist who earned his Ph.D. from UK's anthropology and sociology departments in 1995. He returned to the university in 2014 to accept the **Thomas R. Ford Distinguished Lecture Award**.

<u>Dr. Olaf Jaime-Riverón</u> completed his Ph.D. on basalt ground stone industries at Tres Zapotes in 2016 under the supervision of Chris Pool. He was the director of the El Tajín archaeological site in Veracruz, Mexico.

<u>Chi Woodrich</u> was a masters student in the department from 2011 to 2013 and a proud member of the Ho-Chunk Nation.

Dr. Jaime-Riverón came to UK from Mexico in 2005. He completed his dissertation in 2016 under the guidance of Chris Pool and had risen to the rank of site and museum director of El Tajín in Veracruz, Mexico before his untimely death in November 2023.
